Re: 2025/26 YEAR 5 SCHOOL JOURNEY TO PGL-GROSVENOR HALL, KENT

We are delighted that many of you are eager for your children to attend a residential school journey to an outdoor pursuit centre. We are pleased to be able to confirm that a residential school journey to Ashford, Kent has been planned for the week **16th – 20th March 2026**. Kingswood Grosvenor Hall is the perfect venue for building a bespoke adventure programme, which includes team-building activities, bushcraft, survival skills, and high adventure activities such as abseiling, crate stacking, laser tag and zip lining.

Children gain incredible skills from attending a residential school journey, including independence, team building, and resilience, while having the opportunity to learn in an outdoor space.

The price this year is **£280 per child**. This includes accommodation and bedding, travel, all meals, and access to all the fantastic activities and experiences. To secure a place for your child, please log into your Arbor account and confirm your child's space with an initial deposit of **£5** to be received by **Friday, 3rd October 2025**.

The remaining balance of £275 can be paid in manageable installments via your Arbor account, with the final payment due by **Friday, 7th March 2025**. Below is a suggested payment plan, but if you would like to discuss an alternative arrangement, please let us know.

with an organisation, The Tony Trust, which provides funding for young people wishing to experience a stay in an outdoor activity centre. We have had great success with this in previous years.

Children will work with an adult at school to complete the application form, and with parental permission, the form will be sent to The Tony Trust. In the past, children have requested grants of up to half the cost of the trip. The Trustees review these applications individually at their meetings and inform the applicants via email, using the contact details provided on the form. The school will also be informed of each applicant's outcome and the amount of any grant offered.
