#### THE 'WHY?'





As early as 6 months old, the brain can recognise differences based in race and appearance.

At just 2 years old, children begin to internalise racial bias and make decisions based on their understanding and interpretation of these By age 12, research suggests that biases, stereotypes and prejudices can become mostly 'fixed'

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


#### Our priorities are...

#### WHAT IS 'ANTIRACIST'?



# Anti-racism refers to a form of action against racial discrimination, bias, systemic racism, and the oppression of marginalized groups.



Race is created to justify enslaving people from Africa (economic engine of country)


Policies and practices that consolidate and protect power bestow unearned economic, social, cultural, and political advantage to people called "white," and unearned disadvantage to people of color

National narrative (ideology, belief system) about people of color being "less than" human (and less than white) justifies mistreatment and inequality (white supremacy)

Inequitable outcomes and experiences resulting from policy decisions in health, housing, employment, education, and life expectancy - reinforces white supremacist beliefs and ideology; dominant narrative uses disparate outcomes as evidence of white superiority, promotes whiteness as "normal" and desirable and justifies inequality

#### BARRIERS TO TALKING ABOUT RACISM








#### Acknowledge

Let your child/ children know that it's perfectly okay to notice skin colour and talk about race. Start talking about what racial differences mean and don't mean.

Possible script: "Well done for noticing…" "Yes, you are right there is a difference in.." "Would you like to know more about…"









#### • Encourage

Encourage your child to ask questions, share observations and experiences, and be respectfully curious about race.





• Model

What children hear from us is less important than what they see us do.

You are a role model to your child. What you say is important, but what you do - the diversity of your friendship circle, for example - is likely to have a bigger impact.










#### Connect

Talk about the histories and experiences of the racial, ethnic, and cultural groups you and your family identify with. Talk about their contributions and acknowledge the less flattering parts of those histories as well.

#### 13th Amendment

Section 1. Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction.

Section 2. Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.





#### • Share

Be honest with your child, in age-appropriate ways, about bigotry and oppression.

Be sure your child knows that the struggle for racin fairness is still happening and that your family can take part in that struggle.










#### Anti-racism is a verb





#### Challenge

Don't be a **"bystander"** on race. Help your child understand what it means to be, and how to be, a change agent.

Whenever possible, connect the conversations you're having to the change you and your child want to see, and to ways to bring about that change.


It's okay to say, "I'm not sure" or "Let's come back to that later, okay?" But then do come back to it.
