The week beginning **27th February - 3rd March** will be Woodhill's annual Book Week. This will be a week to further inspire and encourage the children's love of reading. Please see below for an outline of the exciting things happening before and during the week!

We are running an **Usborne 'Ready steady read' Readathon** and we'd love your child to join in. It's been proven that children who read for pleasure are more likely to be successful and happy throughout their lives (OECD). The Readathon will be launched on the **10th of February**. The forms and any outstanding contributions should be handed in by the **3rd March**. Ready Steady Read and Ready Steady Listen events are a fantastic way to encourage pupils to celebrate reading and develop a lifelong love of books.

Our school can also earn up to 60% of the total funds raised from the sponsored read or listen in FREE books for the school. Choose the books which will most excite your children, from new sets of class reads to fascinating fact books to fill our library.

World Book Day will be taking place on **Wednesday 1st March** and we hope you'll join us as we come together to celebrate our World Book Day in school.

Every year on World Book Day we are overwhelmed by the enthusiasm of our school community. Dressing up or bringing books into school will be a big part of the celebrations and what families particularly enjoy about World Book Day.

We will have lots of fun activities taking place throughout the week including reading to children, book swap, where children will have the opportunity to exchange books and exciting competitions. Please drop off your unwanted books in the box inside the Groves. Whether or not you've got a book to bring along to swap, come and browse and find something you might like to read on our world book day.

On the **23rd February** will be opening the Groves with a selection of materials to choose from to make. Please join us to see what they've made. We will be dressing up this year and making costumes but we also invite children to wear their pyjamas to celebrate reading at bedtime.

World book day school competition - Children will be asked to create a scene from their favourite story in a shoe box and brought into class.




Tuesday 28th February

On this day children will receive a World Book Day £1 Book Token which can be taken to your local bookseller and swapped for one of the designated World Book Day books.
